

A journey of two+ years

In late 2010, I received a call to work with a young lady, student at North High School – someone that seemed totally disengaged from school. I was new to this mentoring at risk students. Oh, sure I had regularly worked with the Teenage Parent program-but I had a captive audience-I came to their classroom. Now I was picking up students after school, but maybe they won't be there; maybe they would hate what they were being signed up for---by a teacher, a parent, a social worker. Well, add to that the fact that this young lady's mother spoke VERY little English and I spoke NO Spanish. How was I going to communicate with this mother? As we got to know each other I learned that this student was very angry about family issues and couldn't care less about school, but was a very talented artist. She had a dream to be able to go to IDEAS a charter high school, but her mother had said NO, and had some real concerns about the academic value of attendance to that school. So I did my investigative homework gathering information to prove to mom what her daughter would learn as a student at IDEAS and the benefits to her daughter. Now how would I communicate that to mom -well, I did. And needless to say her daughter has flourished in that setting.

How do I know that? I have been the family representative for the last year and a half at what IDEAS calls a POL (presentation of learning). The POL is the 'parent/teacher conference' of IDEAS (& Mosaic) with the student making a presentation on what they are learning to their parent(s) and guidance counselor-a format I am VERY much in favor of.

This young lady will graduate this coming June and everyone at Horizons4Girls is VERY excited.....stay tuned as I continue to share in future newsletters this journey this student and I have made together.
